
Answer #129

The answer is (b): the reading will indicate a smaller voltage or a smaller charge, as seen in an mpeg video by clicking your mouse on the photograph below.



When a positively charged rod is brought close to the terminal, it pulls electrons out of the electroscope toward the terminal. Because the electroscope was charged *negative* by induction, pulling away some of the charge results in a smaller charge, or a smaller voltage, on the electroscope, as observed.
